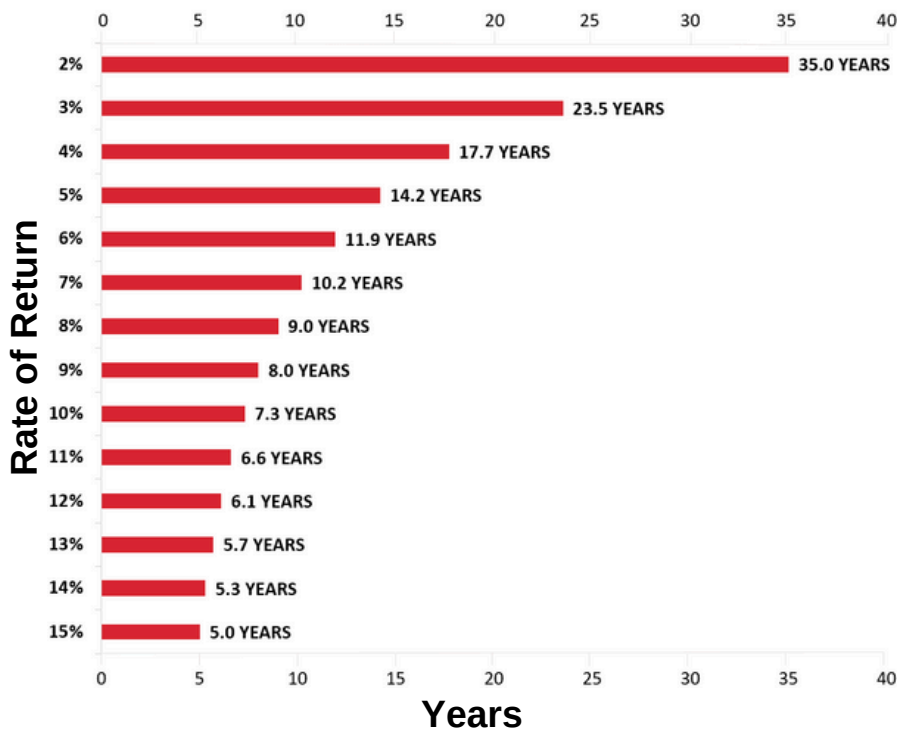
For Your Money to Double?

Rule of 72

72 / Annual Rate of Return =
Eg: 72 / 5.50 = 13

The **Rule of 72** is a classic shortcut that estimates how long it takes to double your investment. It is a quick way to approximate the number.

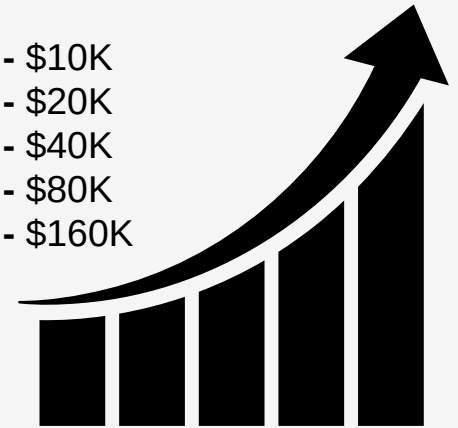
A more precise formula is used to calculate the actual number, as seen below:



The Speed of Doubling Your Money

Here's roughly how often an investor would double their money at 5.50% annual returns:

2025 - \$10K
2038 - \$20K
2051 - \$40K
2064 - \$80K
2077 - \$160K
