wheat harvest, is paramount. Please take necessary precautions to prevent accidents and injuries. Together, let's ensure a safe and successful harvest season for everyone.



Animal Nutrition Intern

Rachel Gras

Hello, my name is Rachel Gras, and I am this year's Hensall Co-op Animal Nutrition Intern.

Here is a little bit about me and my role at Hensall Co-op: I am currently entering my third year at the University of Guelph, studying food and agriculture business with a minor in agriculture. I grew up on a pig farm just north of Seaforth, and have worked in the dairy industry for over five years now. Another fun fact about me is that this is my second



summer at Hensall Co-op. Last year, I worked out of the Mitchell location as the Field Marketer Intern.

So far, I have really enjoyed my position at the Co-op, as I get to experience various aspects of animal nutrition. I have worked with both the poultry and ruminant teams, and will soon be working with the swine team. I typically spend two days a week with the poultry team, doing tasks such as vaccinating, weighing, and taking blood samples from different customers' barns. I have also performed flock health checks and attended poultry feed sales meetings with the poultry team.

During my first two weeks with the dairy team, I trained with the Shur-Gain interns in St. Mary's to learn how to conduct a forage focus and crop monitoring project. I will be working on these projects this summer alongside the Shur-Gain interns. For the forage focus project, I visited customers' farms and performed tasks such as Shaker boxes, bunk density, and taking faecal samples. This data will be compiled into a research project with the Shur-Gain interns.

For crop monitoring, I visit the same farms every two weeks to monitor and take samples of different producers' fields (typically hay fields). I then write reports to send back to producers on how their fields have been changing. With the Dairy team, I have also shadowed Jessie Nyland, David Coates, and Holly Holyoake, and attended special events such as a Grober meeting, where we toured the Grober milk replacer plant, worked with the Lallemand team from Kansas and Alberta, and participated in understanding dairy rations meeting put on by Shur-Gain.

Overall, I have enjoyed my time at the Hensall Co-op and cannot wait to see what else I will experience this summer!

Our team is delighted to support local organizations and create opportunities for scrap materials to be reused and repurposed.

Bean Donation

Hensall Co-op continues to support those who need assistance - with rising inflation and food costs, we understand that many communities face food insecurity. Recently, we donated three skids of beans which weighed a total of 2,983 lbs. These beans will stay local and will be distributed through the Huron County Food Bank Distribution Centre.

We are thankful for our amazing staff and members who have made it possible for this donation to occur. Together we grow communities.

From the Huron County Food Bank Distribution Centre:

The donated beans are first divided by variety, and then packaged into separate plastic bags (portioned for families). We then place several of these bags, ensuring to provide a mix of different bean varieties, into our plastic transfer totes. The beans are then added as an option on the inventory product list that we offer to the 13 food banks and 25 agencies we distribute to. Everyone who specifically requests the beans gets the number of totes they ask for. Each food bank and agency knows the needs of their clientele, ensuring the beans go to where they will be used and appreciated.

Safety at Hensall Co-op

Caught in the Act

As summer temperatures rise, we must be aware of the impact heat stress can have on our health and safety. Heat stress occurs when the body cannot cool itself enough to maintain a healthy temperature, leading to a range of heat-related illnesses that can affect anyone, regardless of age or fitness level. In our workplace, where physical activity and outdoor work happen daily, understanding heat stress is essential for ensuring everyone's well-being.

Heat stress can lead to several heat-related conditions, from mild heat rashes and cramps to more severe heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Heat stroke is particularly dangerous and can be fatal if not treated promptly. High temperatures can impair cognitive functions, making concentrating difficult and increasing the risk of accidents. Heat stress can reduce productivity, increase the likelihood of errors, and exacerbate fatigue. Prevention is the best strategy for combating heat stress.

Kelly Lynn Charest is Caught in the Act, taking some time on a hot day to cool off and drinking water to keep hydrated. Understanding and preventing heat stress is not just a seasonal concern but an ongoing priority for workplace safety. By staying

informed, recognizing the signs, and taking preventive measures, we can ensure a healthier work environment for everyone.



Helpful tips to stay safe:

- **Hydration:** Drink plenty of water throughout the day. Avoid caffeinated beverages, as they can dehydrate you.
- **Rest Breaks:** Plan your day according to the temperature. Don't plan the heaviest tasks for when they are the hottest, if possible. Use airconditioned rooms to cool down during breaks.
- **Appropriate Clothing:** Wear lightweight and loose-fitting clothing (when appropriate) to help your body stay cool.
- Monitor Yourself and Others: Keep an eye on your symptoms and watch out for your coworkers. Ask for help when feeling unwell.



Summer Road Safety

As summer sets in, it's crucial to prioritize safety on our roads. With the increased presence of farm equipment, be patient and share the road respectfully. Always stay alert and drive

cautiously.

Additionally, with children out of school and playing outside, be extra vigilant in residential areas, near roads, and in your own yards. By staying aware and considerate, we can all contribute to a safer summer for everyone.


Drayton Expansion

The expansion will enable Drayton to accommodate and separate an increased quantity of IP beans while meeting the demands of our commercial grains.

Expansion Includes:

2 concrete silos

- Silos are 46' x 120'
- Each has a 150,000 bu holding capacity
- New and faster receiving pit
 - Will unload at 16,000 bu/hr
- Total receiving speed will double to 30,000 bu/hr







Tilbury Expansion

We are constructing the Seed & Crop Protection warehouse at the Tilbury location to accommodate the growth in the Essex, Chatham-Kent, and Lambton County areas. The diverse agricultural demands, spanning over 40 different crops such as vegetables, IP soybeans, and edible beans, necessitate a wide range of products. Our warehouse will stock seeds, fertilizers, crop protection products, and foliar fertilizers, ensuring that we can meet our customers' needs promptly. The facility will be heated and equipped with numerous bulk tanks, enhancing the value we provide to our customers.


