

# **Strong Communities Initiative**

The Strong Communities Initiative supports projects that help to protect and build the strength of rural communities. Projects were open to registered charities and were reviewed by Hensall Co-op on specific criteria that measured the

impact on the local community and the sustainability of the project.

#### 2024 Winners:

Palmerston and District Hospital Foundation, located in Palmerston, ON, has been selected as one of the grant recipients. They will receive \$10,000 in funding to aid in purchasing an MRI machine. This initiative will bring much-needed high-quality healthcare services to the residents of Palmerston and the surrounding communities, ensuring



they have access to healthcare of the highest standard.

# Where Our Products Go: Propane Tank Installation

The Hensall Co-op Energy department's services are in high demand. We had the opportunity to perform one of our largest propane installations in recent years. The massive 23,000 gallon propane tank (87,055 liters) was custom built in Quebec then transported to the farm in Ontario.

It weighs a hefty 44,000 pounds and sits atop a custom cradle. The inside diameter is 10.75 feet and the tank is nearly an inch thick. This will be feeding a 91.5 million BTU vaporizer that will be running massive crop dryers and equipment.

We love being able to make "big" things happen for our customers!


# Safety at Hensall Co-op

# Caught in the Act

Ensuring the safety and reliability of our vehicles on a daily basis is crucial for maintaining efficient operations and protecting workers. Regular pre-trip

inspections are a fundamental practice that helps identify potential issues before they escalate, ensuring safety and productivity. We perform these on all vehicles used at Hensall Co-op, including commercial vehicles, forklifts, skid steers, loaders, and tractors.

The primary reason for conducting pre-trip inspections is safety. By thoroughly checking the vehicle before using it for the day, drivers can identify and address potential issues that could lead to accidents. This includes checking the brakes, tires, lights, steering and lifting



systems. Ensuring these components are in good working condition can prevent breakdowns and accidents, protecting drivers, other people on the road, and workers in the area.

Caught in the Act was Mark Hutchinson at our Greenway location, who was performing his pre-trip inspection on their one-tonne truck before heading out. Knowing that the vehicle has been thoroughly inspected and is in good working condition provides peace of mind to the driver. This confidence lets the driver focus on the task at hand.

Whether for personal or commercial use, taking the time to perform inspections on your vehicles can make a significant difference in the overall safety and reliability of the vehicle.



# Fall Road Safety

As harvest is in full swing, there's an increased presence of tractors, trucks, and equipment moving on the roads, in the yards, and in the fields. Whether you're driving or working near equipment, please exercise caution and follow safety protocols to

ensure a safe harvest season for everyone. Staying aware of your surroundings and being patient can help prevent accidents and keep both drivers and workers safe during this busy time.

## **Tractor Training Course**

Hensall Co-op has introduced a new Tractor Training Course for yard operators and some members of leadership from various locations.

This course will increase safety in our yards, help maintain top safety records and comply with any mandates from government bodies. It's essential that we provide training on all the equipment our employees operate, and we are always looking to improve our training programs.

# Enhancing Security at our Hensall Location: A New Initiative for a Safer Community

Effective October 1, 2024, we have introduced the presence of our security patrol team. Hensall Co-op has enlisted the services of TNT Security Inc. to provide a watchful eye on our property. The security team will maintain a visible presence during off-peak times, ensuring a secure environment at all hours. Their presence fosters a sense of safety among visitors, employees and the local community by effectively discouraging potential law violators.

healthy meal without artificial preservatives, flavours, or colours. This cooking method also removes the oxygen from the package and creates full pasteurization allowing The Screaming Chef meals to stay in the refrigerator for up to 90 days.

# **Bloom Expansion**

To better serve our customers, we are currently expanding our Bloom, MB

location. This upgrade will enable faster unloading times and increase our storage capacity. The new grain bins are 2400MT each, which will add 4800MT in storage. Additionally, it will enhance our ability to segregate beans, improving the overall quality for our end-users.



# **Drayton Expansion**

The expansion at our Drayton location is well underway and our two new concrete silos are on track to be ready in time for the 2024 harvest. This expansion will enable Drayton to accommodate and separate an increased quantity of IP beans while meeting the demands of our commercial grains.







# **Brussels Expansion**

Exciting news! We're building a brand new 1,750-tonne concrete silo at our Brussels, ON, location. The building will be complete just in time for the 2024 corn harvest. This expansion will allow us to elevate our storage capabilities and meet the demands of our customers.







# **Tilbury Expansion**

We are happy to announce that the Seed & Crop Protection warehouse at the Tilbury location is now complete and operational.



This 6,000 square foot expansion was critical to accommodate the growth in the Essex, Chatham-Kent, and Lambton County areas. The diverse agricultural demands, spanning over 40 different crops such as vegetables, IP soybeans, and edible beans, necessitate a wide range of products. Our warehouse will stock seeds, fertilizers, crop protection products, and foliar fertilizers, ensuring that we can promptly meet our customers' needs.
